OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

Memorial

The Bible sings of the beauty of Mount Carmel (Song of Songs) and this mountain, for Jeremiah (Jer 46: 13), already evoked the coming of God. This is where the prophet Elijah bore witness to the one God against the prophets of Baal, and it is also where numerous hermits attracted by its caves, came to seek refuge. The monks later became more numerous and received there, in 1212, a rule that is at the origin of the Carmelite Order.

On July 16, according to Carmelite tradition, we celebrate the memory of the day when St. Simon Stock, the first General of the Order, received the "scapular" from the hands of the Virgin . Many Christians have worn this scapulary after him, as a tangible sign of the invisible protection of the Virgin Mary over them.

Let us not hesitate to turn to Mary, the mother of all men, and "take her to our home" as John the Apostle says.

FIRST READING

A reading from the First Book of Kings 18: 42-45

In the valley that is at the foot of Mount Carmel, the prophet Elijah said ^[L]to King Ahab, "Go up, eat and drink, for there is the sound of a heavy ^[SEP]rain." So Ahab went up to eat and drink, while Elijah climbed to the top ^[SEP]of Carmel, crouched down to the earth, and put his head between his ^[SEP]knees. "Climb up and look out to sea," he directed his servant, who ^[SEP]went up and looked, but reported, "There is nothing". Seven times he ^[SEP]said, "Go look again!" And the seventh time the youth reported, ^[SEP]"There is a cloud as small as a man's hand rising from the sea." Elijah ^[SEP]said, "Go and say to Ahab, 'Harness up and leave the mountain before ^[SEP]the rain stops you'." In a trice, the sky drew dark with clouds and wind, ^[L]and a heavy rain fell.
