Blessed MARY ALPHONSINE

Memorial

Mother Marie-Alfonsine (Sultaneh) Danil Ghattas was born in Jerusalem on 4th October, 1843, one of nineteen children of a hardworking Christian family who often prayed together. From an early age, she felt God was calling her to the religious life. At the age of 14, she entered the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Apparition and, after pronouncing her vows, was assigned to the school directed by the Sisters in Bethlehem to teach the Catechism, at which she soon excelled, becoming a tireless but humble educator.

Sr. Marie-Alfonsine founded confraternities and associations and promoted devotion to Our Lady and the prayer of the Rosary. She was favoured with several visions of Our Lady, who eventually asked her to found a Congregation to further the education of the girls of that land where Jesus himself had exalted their human dignity; this was to take the name of 'Sisters of the Rosary.' Fr. Joseph Tannous Yamine was appointed her Director and helped her to find a house for the first postulants. After various trials and difficulties, she was given permission to leave the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Apparition to enter the new Congregation of the Rosary. She and eight others made their first vows in 1885.

From her family she learned to have a deep reverence and faith in Providence, and a great filial trust in the Blessed Virgin. She had two special virtues above all : on the one hand a love of silence and the hidden life, and on the other, a love of the cross and self-sacrifice. Mother Marie-Alfonsine was 'Lover of the Blessed Virgin and a Confidante of heaven.'

She died on the feast of the Annunciation, 15th March 1927, and was beatified on 22nd November 2009.

May the example and intercession of Blessed Marie-Alfonsine confirm us in doing good and obtain for us a constant trust in divine Providence and the motherly protection of our Lady.
