Saint EUTHYMIUS, the Abbot

Optional memorial

Born in 377 of in Militéne, Armenia, Saint Euthymius the Great was ordained a priest and appointed Inspector of the surrounding monasteries, but, driven by his desire for solitude, he took refuge in Patestine, in Jerusalem in 406. He remained some time in the monastery of Faran, and others thereafter, as to escape his reputation of performing miracles. He had a great influence on the monastic life of Patestine, and even on St Saba who owed him much. He led the Arab tribes to Christian faith and worked to bring back to the unity of the Church those who were separated from it, and among them the Empress Eudoxia, wife of Theodosius II. He had to suffer to remain faithful to the Councils of Ephesus and Chalcedon. He died almost a centenarian, 20 January 473.
