Saint CORNELIUS the Centurion

Optional Memorial

According to the Acts of the Apostles, Cornelius was a centurion of the Italic cohort stationed at Caesarea. He was pious and "God-fearing" and gave alms to the Jewish community. He was the first Gentile to convert to Christianity and it was Peter who baptized him and his family, after having instructed him (Acts 10). According to some traditions, Peter also consecrated him bishop. His cult is attested already in Jerusalem in the 10th century.

The conversion of Cornelius was a decisive central event in the book of Acts because it was the first step in the journey of the Gospel from Jerusalem to Samaria, then to the pagan nations. The Word of God is to spread "to the ends of the earth", according to the desire of the risen Jesus (1: 8). Israel, the first recipient of the promises, must open up to other nations, and behold, God himself intervenes, by his Spirit, for the conversion of the first pagan, Cornelius.

The liturgy of this day highlights the role of the Holy Spirit who precedes Peter and the Apostles. It is He who predisposed the heart of Cornelius to believe in Christ. He continues with his power to act in the human heart and continues to lead the Church even further, beyond all boundaries.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles

10: 25-27, 34-35, 44-49

When Peter entered Caesarea, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being." While he conversed with him, he went in and found many people gathered together. Then he proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him".

While Peter was still speaking these things, the holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God. Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for a few days.
