Saint GEORGE, Martyr

Memorial

At the end of the fourth century there was in Lydda (Lod), over the tomb of St George, a church that was already a place of pilgrimage. Tradition is unanimous in honouring him as a soldier put to death for the faith. The worship of the one called "the great martyr" became very popular in the East, and even in the West. St George appears among the saints as a soldier who wore the armour of God to lead the fight against the forces of evil, symbolized by the dragon.

In the lives of the martyrs, the Church, the Body of Christ, relives the paschal mystery of its Head. They are witnesses to us and manifest the meaning of the words of St. Paul: "becoming like Christ in the sharing of his sufferings by being conformed to his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead." (Phil 3: 10-11)

Perpetual light will shine on your Saints, O Lord, and life without end for ever, alleluia.

COLLECT

Lord, we proclaim your power and we humbly beseech you: may St. George be as prompt to help us in our weakness as he was in imitating the Passion of your Son, Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.
