Saint PAOLA, EUSTOCHIO and MELANIA

RELIGIOUS

Optional memorial

Saint Paula Roman (347-404) was a noble of Rome. Married at 15, she had five children, including a daughter, Eustochio. Widowed at 31, she followed the ascetic ideal of noble Marcella and turned her own house into a cenacle. She was a disciple of St. Jerome, who taught her Hebrew, and she distinguished herself by her knowledge of the Bible. Along with her daughter Eustochio, she followed St. Jerome, as he moved to Palestine (in 385), and went to Bethlehem, where she led a very austere monastic life, spending her time in prayer, work and study. Her wisdom and gentleness attracted many women to Christ, from all backgrounds, and her monastery had great spiritual influence. She died on the 26 of January 404, at the age of 56, and was buried at the cave of the Nativity.

Saint Eustochio devoted herself to God very young and became a spiritual daughter to St. Jerome, who addressed a letter to her, referred to as 22a, and entitled "custody of virginity". Her too, knew Hebrew, and became of precious help to her teacher, who dedicated to her his "Commentaries on Isaiah and Ezekiel". After the death of her Mother, she lead the monastery and took care of little Paula, the daughter of her brother Tossozio and his wife Leta. She died some year between 413 to 419, away from the convent which had been ruined by the Pelagians.

St. Melania the Younger, born from a noble roman family in 333, following the example of St. Melania the Elder, had wanted to embrace the ascetic life, but was forced by her parents to get marry at age 14. Having lost both of her sons, Melania persuaded her husband to live in perpetual continence. They stayed in Africa and finally settled in Jerusalem in 417. After the death of her husband, she built a monastery on Mount of Olives. She died in 439.

These three women throughout their lives aspired to "the knowledge of Christ's love", as referred to in St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians., to this knowledge Christ which is the science of the saints.
